Participants in the International Community Engagement Program (PKM) exhibited significant improvements in understanding these topics through interactive presentations and discussions. The positive feedback and active engagement during the program underscore its success in promoting a deeper understanding of the benefits of diversity. As Kymlicka and Banting (2006) argue, linguistic and cultural diversity are valuable assets that enhance community strength and resilience. By implementing inclusive policies and initiatives, communities can harness the full potential of their diverse populations, leading to sustainable development and social harmony. This discussion underscores the necessity of investing in diversity to create vibrant, dynamic, and resilient communities.

Abstrak

Mempromosikan multibahasa dan keragaman budaya adalah investasi strategis dalam ketahanan dan kemakmuran komunitas. A. Introduction

Linguistic and cultural diversity often creates division and conflict within a society. This perspective is frequently influenced by fear of differences and misunderstanding between distinct groups. However, if managed well, such diversity should serve as a source of wealth that enriches social and cultural interactions within the community. Fishman (1991) states that a language can function as a communication tool and a cultural identity that binds communities together.

On the other hand, multilingualism and cultural diversity are fundamental elements for building dynamic and resilient communities. According to Baker (2011), the ability to communicate in multiple languages enhances cross-cultural understanding and promotes tolerance. This is essential in diverse societies to create social cohesion and harmony. Appreciation of cultural diversity also fosters innovation and creativity, which in turn, strengthens the economy and social stability.

A tangible example of this can be seen in the Indonesian and Songkhla communities in Thailand. Both communities are highly heterogeneous yet manage to live peacefully side by side. In Indonesia, more than 700 regional languages are spoken, reflecting a vast cultural richness. Research by Sneddon (2003) indicates that multilingualism has become one of the reinforcing factors of a strong national identity in Indonesia. Similarly, in Songkhla, a community composed of various ethnicities and religions maintains harmony through mutual respect in cultures, as discussed in a study by Srisang (2000).

This diversity not only becomes a strength in maintaining social cohesion but also provides benefits in various areas of life. In the education field, for instance; an inclusive curriculum that values multiculturalism can produce more open-minded and tolerant students. A study by Banks (2006) shows that students who learn in environments that appreciate diversity tend to have better academic performance and stronger social skills.

These are the main reasons this article is written and presented in the International Community Service (PKM) project of Kaba Academic Society, that is, to demonstrate how linguistic and cultural diversity can make societies stronger in various aspects of life. By promoting multilingualism and appreciating cultural diversity, not only more inclusive and harmonious communities are created but also strengthen the foundations of sustainable and resilient development. UNESCO (2003) stated in the Universal Declaration on Cultural Diversity, that cultural diversity is a source of innovation, exchange, and creativity crucial for human progress.

B. Implementation Method

This study employs a library research methodology, incorporating a comprehensive literature review that draws on references from a diverse range of sources, including books, journal articles, and other scholarly works. The program is a joint initiative between the KABA Academic Society Foundation and the Al-Hidayah Waqf Foundation for Education and Social Sciences. This collaborative

effort is conducted as part of an International Community Service (PKM) project in Bang Khlam, Songkhla Province, Thailand, on Saturday, June 29, 2024.

The implementation of this program involves various methods, including presentations, question-and-answer sessions, and discussions. These activities engage 250 participants from the Al-Hidayah Waqf Foundation for Education and Social Sciences, along with lecturers and students from 35 universities who participated as members of the PKM KABA Academic Society initiative. This multi-faceted approach aims to facilitate a deep understanding among participants regarding the significance of linguistic and cultural diversity in fostering societal unity and integrity.

Additionally, it is anticipated that this community service initiative will yield positive outcomes, enhancing participants' comprehension of the importance multilingualism and cultural diversity play in promoting social cohesion. Furthermore, the program aspires to address and offer solutions to the complex challenges faced by multidimensional societies. Through collaborative and educational efforts, the initiative seeks to empower participants with the knowledge and skills necessary to navigate and contribute to a culturally diverse world effectively.

C. The Result

In this section, implementing the service activities process is explored, and the literature topic "Promoting Multilingualism and Cultural Diversity to Strengthen Communities" is presented. This examination will detail the various stages of execution, from initial planning and coordination to the actual delivery of content. The approaches used to engage community members and participants, including interactive discussions, and educational sessions aimed at highlighting the value of linguistic and cultural diversity. Special attention will be given to the collaborative efforts between various stakeholders, including educational institutions, community organizations, and international partners. By providing a thorough account of the process and its outcomes, this section aims to offer valuable insights and practical strategies for successfully promoting multilingualism and cultural diversity in diverse community settings.

1. The implementation of the International Community Service

The Al-Hidayah Waqf Foundation for Education and Social Development Chairman, Adult Mentham, officially inaugurated the faculty Community Service Program (PKM) on June 29, 2024. In his opening remarks, Mentham emphasized that the foundation is highly receptive to collaborating with universities worldwide. This openness to international cooperation is evident in the partnership with the KABA Academic Society Foundation, involving faculty members and students from various universities in Indonesia. This collaboration is anticipated to expand the scope of the Al-Hidayah Foundation's partnerships significantly. Mentham expressed that the scholarly presentations and research disseminated by the KABA Academic Society members, covering a wide array of disciplines, enhance the knowledge base of teachers, students, and the broader community participating in the event. benefits but also to foster long-term academic and social development within the community.

Furthermore, the involvement of diverse academic professionals and students is seen as a strategic move to broaden the foundation's network, facilitating a more inclusive and comprehensive approach to education and social development. This initiative underscores the foundation's commitment to creating a global academic dialogue and enriching the educational landscape through crosscultural and interdisciplinary exchanges. The collaborative efforts are poised to deliver valuable insights and foster a deeper understanding of various scientific fields, ultimately contributing to the foundation's mission of advancing education and social welfare.

By fostering such international collaborations, the Al-Hidayah Waqf Foundation aims to build a robust platform for continuous learning and community development, ensuring that the benefits of this initiative extend well beyond the immediate participants to impact the larger educational and social frameworks in the region.

Following the opening ceremony, the community service activities were organized into two distinct sessions. The first session featured keynote addresses, where prominent speakers presented material pertinent to the event's overarching theme. The second session comprised in-depth studies across various scientific disciplines, focusing on the theme "Tackling Community Challenges in the IMT-GT Region: A Multidisciplinary Strategy for Empowering Local Voices." This session provided a platform for a comprehensive examination of community issues and proposed multidisciplinary strategies to empower local communities. The second session was conducted both in-person and virtually, utilizing a hybrid Zoom setup to facilitate broader participation and engagement.

2. The Discussion on Promoting Multilingualism and Cultural Diversity to Strengthen the Community

The importance of multilingualism and cultural diversity in contemporary society cannot be overstated. Multilingualism, the ability to communicate in multiple languages, enriches personal and communal interactions, fostering a deeper understanding and appreciation of different cultures. This linguistic diversity enhances cognitive skills, promotes empathy, and broadens perspectives, allowing individuals to navigate a globalized world more effectively. This cross-cultural competence is invaluable in diverse fields such as international business, diplomacy, and education, where effective communication and cultural sensitivity are paramount. Furthermore, multilingualism contributes to cognitive benefits, including improved problem-solving skills, enhanced memory, and greater mental flexibility. As communities become more interconnected, the promotion of multilingualism not only strengthens social cohesion but also prepares individuals to thrive in a complex and diverse global landscape. By embracing multilingual education and supporting language diversity, societies can foster more inclusive, empathetic, and culturally competent communities.

b) Benefits of Cultural Diversity

Furthermore, promoting cultural diversity helps to combat discrimination and prejudice, as it encourages dialogue and mutual understanding. c) Strengthening Social Cohesion

This diversity in thought and expertise creates a fertile ground for entrepreneurship and economic dynamism, as varied skills and insights contribute to more adaptive and resilient economic structures. Additionally, diverse communities can better respond to market changes and financial challenges, leveraging their wide-ranging capabilities to sustain growth and development. Fostering an inclusive environment that values and integrates cultural diversity, these communities build economic strength and ensure long-term sustainability and prosperity.

e) Education and Multilingualism

Cummins (2005) highlights that multilingual education equips learners to understand and appreciate cultural diversity, an essential trait for global citizenship. Exposing students to multiple languages and cultures promotes empathy, tolerance, and a broader worldview. These attributes are crucial in today's interconnected world, where cross-cultural communication and collaboration are increasingly important. Individuals educated in a multilingual environment are better prepared to participate in international affairs, global business, and multicultural communities, leveraging their linguistic and cultural skills to foster inclusive and effective interactions. As such, multilingual education enhances cognitive and linguistic capabilities and culturates socially responsible and global-minded citizens.
